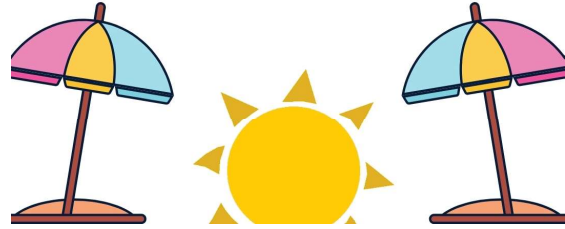

It is our intention that every member of our community who would like to join us for in person worship will be able to do so over the course of the High Holy Days. *Unfortunately, traditional and previous seating arrangements will not be in effect this year.*

Your Temple membership includes tickets for up to 2 adult members of your household and all children age 24 and younger. You can purchase tickets for family members, such as parents and children over 25.

Returning this year is a multi-media service in the amphitheater. You do need to request tickets to attend, but seats will not be assigned.
